BATTERY RECYCLING FACTORY FIRE BRIDGEHILL



CAMPBELLFIELD, MELBOURNE 9TH AUGUST 2020

A battery recycling factory was consumed by flames on August 9th, 2020, in Campbellfield, Melbourne. The fire broke out just before 4:30am (AEST) and the cause of the fire is under investigation. More than 70 firefighters battled the blaze. Campbellfield, Coolaroo, Dallas and Somerton were issued a community warning for smoke. There were no injuries or fatalities.

Loud explosions could be heard due to the batteries reacting with fire. From the image (left) you can see an explosion taking place while firefighters tackled the blaze.

The materials within the factory also react to water so firefighters used foam to control the spread of the fire and smoke.
